Prerequisite Course Pequirements

Biology - One academic year with lab

Chemistry - One academic year of general or inorganic with lab **Advanced Chemistry** - One academic year of advanced chemistry with lab (Semester requirements include: one semester of organic chemistry with lab followed by a second semester of biochemistry {lab not required}). Organic II is recommended but not required (Quarter requirements include: two quarters of organic chemistry with lab followed by a third quarter of biochemistry {no lab required}).

Physics - One semester or two quarters with lab

English - One academic year or the portion of an academic year required for the baccalaureate degree at an accredited American college or university

The required courses must be taken on a graduated grading scale (A, B, C, D, F); may not be taken on a pass/fail basis; must earn a grade of "C" or better. DCG does not consider +/-when averaging GPAs.

**An academic year equals two semesters or three quarters or one semester and two quarters.

Application

DMD candidates can only apply to The Dental College of Georgia through the ADEA Associated American Dental Schools Application Service (AADSAS). The ADEA AADSAS application is available online at adea.org. The timeline for applying to DCG through AADSAS is the first week of June through September 30.

Letters of Recommendation

Option 1 includes a packet/composite letter for an applicant's college. In addition, a letter from a dentist. Option 2 includes four letters. One letter from an academic advocate (science faculty) and a second letter from a dentist. The two remaining letters can be from another instructor, advisor, dentists, employers, or personal reference.

Supplemental Information

After receiving the AADSAS application, all applicants will be emailed a link to the DCG supplemental application within 1-14 business days. Based on review of their AADSAS application, supplemental application, letters of recommendation, and DAT scores, interviews may be granted. If an applicant is taking the DAT after submitting their application are responsible for emailing an unofficial copy of their scores to DCGadmissions@augusta.edu.

Dental Admissions Test

All applicants must have taken the Dental Admission Test (DAT) within 3 years of applying; Cost \$470(subject to change). The DAT must be taken by the September 30 deadline, 11 months before those accepted are due to enroll. The DAT can be taken every 90 days. Application Fee

The AADSAS application fee is \$248 (subject to change) for the first school. Applying to more dental schools is \$103 each (subject to change). The DCG supplemental application fee of \$30 is non-refundable and must be paid at the time of application submission.

Acceptance Deposit

The \$500(in-state) \$1000(out-of-state) acceptance deposit, which will be credited toward first semester matriculation fees, is required. This is a non-refundable deposit.

Interviews

Required: By invitation only; Normally held from mid-August to December; Candidates will participate in two one-on-one interviews mainly with members of the DCG faculty. The committee members will help assess the applicant's personality, motivation and ability.

Other Factors

The Committee considers other factors such as research and health care and experiences, leadership, community services or programs, family responsibilities, national recognition, ethnic or cultural backgrounds and commitment to practice in Georgia, underserved areas or dental health professional shortage areas.

Curriculum

The Dental College of Georgia awards the D.M.D. degree. The program of study consists of eight semesters spread over 47 months. This 291 hours includes clinical and basic science courses as well as business, ethics, and cultural professionalism. These courses are taught throughout the eight semesters. Clinical treatment of patients, including restorative dentistry, begins in the second year.

Community Service

Dental students are required 25 community services hours each year (seniors 10 hours). They are responsible for securing their own locations for volunteerism allowing them the flexibility to serve where they really feel they can make a difference.

Summer Opportunities

Student Educational Enrichment Program (SEEP) is a seven-week, academic enrichment program for pre-college and college students interested in the health professions who are underrepresented and/or socially, educationally, or economically disadvantaged. /icensure Examination

All students are required to pass National Board Parts I and II examinations in order to graduate. Seniors and juniors will have the opportunity to take the Central Regional Dental Testing Services Inc. exam to become eligible to practice dentistry in Georgia and various other states. CRDT is a testing service comprised of 19 member State Boards of Dentistry who have joined together to develop and administer fair, valid and reliable clinical competency examinations in dentistry. Graduates of the Dental College of Georgia are eligible for examination by all U.S. dental licensing boards. In reference to the National Board Parts I and II, which are required to practice dentistry, DCG students' scores are consistently among the highest in the nation.

Patient Care

Students begin treating patients as early as their second year at DCG. During 2018-2019 our dental students treated 34,724 patients, resulting in 67,400 procedures.



Research

The Dental Research Center, in collaboration with other units at Augusta University and the University System of Georgia, focuses on multidisciplinary research in the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of orofacial diseases. The Dental College of Georgia has an active student/resident research group who success is evident in their awards, presentations and publications.

Nental Student Organizations

There are 15 active dental student organizations. They offer ways for students to get involved in volunteer opportunities , social events, cultural projects, outreach and fundraisers. The organizations provide networking, education, entertainment and a sense of community outside of class.

General Information for Applicants

Re-applicants

After an applicant has been unsuccessful, applicants are encouraged to contact our office to schedule an advising consultation to discuss areas of their application that can be improved. Applicants may apply three consecutive times. Before submitting a fourth application, individuals must take at least one academic year to become more competitive before reconsideration by the committee.

Residency

The Dental College of Georgia currently accepts primarily Georgia residents and up to 10% out of state students. International students that may be eligible for admissions must present permanent resident documentation and proof of residing in Georgia at least 12 months before enrollment. All eligible applicants are required to have a minimum of 90 semester hours of college coursework at an American accredited college or university. All applicants who are granted an interview must show additional documentation as proof of lawful presence in the United States before being accepted.

Transfer Students, Advanced Standing and Foreign Trained Dentists

The Dental College of Georgia does not accept transfer, advanced standing students, or foreign trained dentists into the DMD program. Special English Language Requirements (TOEFL)

Applicants whose native language is not English are REQUIRED to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). The four hour exam will cover all four language skills for effective communication: speaking, listening, reading and writing. Applicants applying to DCG must achieve a minimum score of 100, with 26 in the speaking component. Test must be taken by the Sept. 30 deadline. To have your scores sent directly to the Dental College of Georgia, you must enter 5425, our TOEFL Institution Code, on the back of the admission ticket.
