

Medications Options with Sexual Assault

▶ Treatment (medications) for exposure to infectious diseases:

▶ GC/Chlamydia

- ▶ ROCEPHIN 500 MG IM, X 1 IN CLINIC
- ▶ DOXYCYCLINE 100 MG BY MOUTH TWICE DAILY X 7 DAYS

▶ HIV prophylaxis if applicable (within 72 hours)

- ▶ TIVICAY 50 MG PO, 1 TAB DAILY X 28 DAYS
- ▶ TRUVADA 200MG/300 MG PO, 1 TAB DAILY X 28 DAYS

▶ Trichomoniasis

- ▶ FLAGYL 500 MG BY MOUTH TWICE DAILY X 7 DAYS, TAKE WITH FOOD (NO ETOH)

▶ Emergency Contraception (EC) to females if applicable

- ▶ LEVONORGESTREL 1.5 MG (PLAN B ONESTEP) 1 TAB PO X 1 (within 72 hours)
- ▶ COPPER IUD (PARAGARD - inserted within 120 hours)
- ▶ COMBINED BC PILLS - those containing Levonorgestrel (within 72 hours)
- ▶ ULIPRISTAL 30 mg (ELLA) 1 TAB PO x 1 (within 120 hours)



Medication Options With Sexual Assault

- ▶ Treatment (medications) for exposure to infectious diseases:
 - ▶ Tetanus vaccine, if applicable
 - ▶ Evaluate vaccination status for HEP B
 - ▶ Immune status will depict HBIG administration, initiation of HBV vaccine series, vaccine booster or no treatment
 - ▶ Evaluate for HPV vaccine
 - ▶ All patients age 9-45 years old who have been sexually assaulted
- ▶ REFERRALS as needed to Counseling and Psychiatry
- ▶ Ensure follow up with Advocates
