

USCAPC end-of-the- year Senate Report

1. The committee met twice with a quorum. Other than our senate liaison, Edgar Johnson, there was no representative from the Pamplin College of Arts & Humanities that took part in any business.
2. Most of the committee's business on policy and curriculum was discussed via email throughout the year with most members taking part.
3. We approved curriculum changes to Chemistry and Kinesiology programs.
4. We revised and approved the Faculty Credentialing Policy and Manual.
5. We revised and approved the Multiple Degrees Policy.
6. We discussed the Academic Conduct Policy and the Senate voted to send our recommendations to the Senate Faculty Rights and Responsibilities Committee for further discussion and review.
7. We discussed the role of the USCAPC and the advising center since advising is under the umbrella of this committee according to the Senate Bylaws.
8. The co-chairs met with Katherine Sweeney and Adam Wyatt to discuss the committee's suggestions for greater communication from the advising center. The suggestion of department liaisons with the advisors was the main part of the discussion.
9. The committee needs to continue reviewing policies and curricula changes promptly.
10. The committee needs to continue communication with the advising center, possibly with a liaison.
11. The Senate needs to ensure that every college has a representative on this committee before business begins in the Fall term. Both Pamplin College representatives removed themselves from the committee at the beginning of the term with no nominated replacement.
