

Medical Student Scholarly Project Course Syllabus All Semesters

Course Description: This course is designed to provide students with a research experience. Students can choose between a 4-week self-guided project, 4-week mentored project, 8-week mentored project, or 12-week mentored project. Students should spend at least 160 hours on a 4-week project, 320 hours on an 8-week project, and 480 hours on a 12-week project. These hours can include time spent in any phase of the curriculum, but the student must have been enrolled at MCG during the time spent working on the research project. Students can submit a multitude of research projects, including but not limited to a literature review, meta-analysis, case report, theory paper, retrospective analysis, conference abstract, poster presentation, and manuscript.

Grade Mode: Pass/Fail

Goal: This course aims to provide students with research and evidence-based medicine skills and encourage aspiring physicians to explore the ways in which research can influence patient care, diagnostic processes, disease prevention strategies, and treatment methods. This course culminates in a personal research experience, which allows students to improve their research skills and apply their knowledge in various ways.

Objectives:

- 1. Demonstrates the ability to perform an appropriate literature search and provide meaningful appraisals of articles reviewed. (MK 1.6), (PBLI 3.1)
- 2. Demonstrates the ability to interpret and summarize prior evidence. (MK 1.6), (PBLI 3.1)
- 3. Demonstrates an understanding of research methods and the ability to draw relevant conclusions. (MK 1.6)
- 4. Demonstrates intellectual curiosity, asks thoughtful questions, and takes initiative. (PBLI 3.5)
- 5. Demonstrates the ability to work as a member of a collaborative research team. (COM 4.2) (SBP 6.1)
- 6. Demonstrates the ability to present written and/or oral summary of the completed scholarly project. (COM 4.4)
- 7. Demonstrates the ability to conduct research in an ethical manner. (MPE 5.3)
- 8. Demonstrates a high level of professionalism through fulfilling commitments and responsibilities in a timely manner. (MPE 5.6)

Evaluation and Grading: Students will be evaluated and receive feedback from their mentor using the Medical Student Scholarly Project assessment form. The course director will evaluate the submitted products when the student chose a self-guided non-mentored project.
